Our theme for Lent is "Seeking God's Ways."

Lent is a time to repent – to turn from our ways and recommit ourselves to the ways of God as revealed in Jesus. As we reflect on the Lenten scripture readings we realize that they reveal truth about the ways of God, as well as the ways God's people get it wrong. And so, we will be invited to consider how we might think God offers one thing but what God really offers can look quite different. Our hope is that within this theme of "seeking God's ways" we will discover space and encouragement to grow more and more faithful to Jesus.

3. How do you usually react when God feels so far away and when things seem too far-fetched? How can we know God's thoughts and ways so that we can make wise decisions in our daily lives?
